

## UKFP Fellows at SMEC 2019

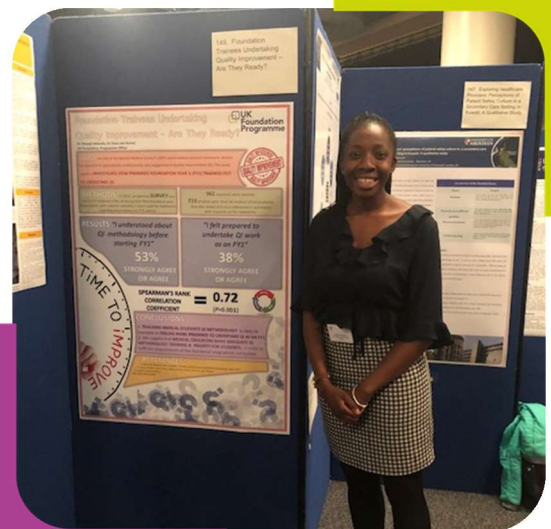

The 9<sup>th</sup> National Scottish Medical Education Conference (SMEC) was held at the Edinburgh International Conference Centre on the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> of May. This years UKFP fellows both presented posters based on a portion of their research conducted during the programme.



Alexander Hollis, an Academic FY2 at Sandwell and West Birmingham NHS Foundation Trust, exhibited a poster exploring the undergraduate factors that influence how prepared newly qualified doctors feel when they begin work, a resource he created based on his own research during his fellowship. Alex has continued to impress with his research into factors affecting F2 doctors entering specialty training after completing foundation training.

Oluseyi Adesalu, an Academic FY2 at Basildon and Thurrock University Hospital presented the outcome of her research entitled 'Foundation Trainees Undertaking Quality Improvement – Are they Ready?' Her research and poster highlight the preparedness of FY1 trainees to handle quality improvement work and the understanding of QI methodology of incoming FY1 trainees. Oluseyi has also been researching and exploring the influences shaping the way in which BME foundation trainees perceive burnout.
